Pavia and Mick Make Podium

Two gymnasts bring home the gold in the all around. Jenna Mick won the Provincial 2 Argo and Nicole Pavia won the Provincial 4 Tyro.

In the Women's Artistic Gymnastics, the Provincial Level 1 team had a good showing.

In Provincial 1 Argo (born in 2000) Olivia Minor won two gold medals, one on the uneven bars and one on the balance beam. After a strong showing, Minor earned a silver in the all around.

Madison Nethercote won three medals this past weekend. All bronze, one on the vault, another on the bars and the third in the all around. Nethercote also earned her very first bronze medal the weekend prior in Kamloops, but was unfortunately missed in the last week's newspaper report.

Selina Habib earned a bronze medal on the balance beam.

Provincial 1 Argo (born 2001-2003) was a separate category from the athletes born in 2000. Okanagan Gymnastics top showing in that category was Sally Haaheim who brought home a silver medal on the balance beam and a second silver medal in the all around in a contingent of 32 athletes.

Braelyn Dillon finished with two bronze medals, one on the vault and the second in the all around.

Grace Fecht competed in the Provincial 2 Argo (born in 2000) category and earned herself a bronze medal on the balance beam.

Jenna Mick competed in the Provincial 2 Argo (born 2001-2002) category and finished with a gold in the all around. Mick finished with a silver on the vault and a bronze on the uneven bars.

Brooke Murray competed in the Provincial 2 Tyro (born in 1998) category and earned herself a gold on the vault.

Hannah Butcher had the strongest finish for a Kelowna athlete in the Provincial 3 Tyro category. Butcher finished with a silver medal on the balance beam.

In the Provincial 4 tyro category, Nicole Pavia took top spot in her first Provincial 4 competition. She earned gold medals on the vault, uneven bars, and a silver on the floor exercise. This strong showing earned her the gold in the all around.

Emma Morel finished with the bronze in the all around, a silver on the uneven bars, a bronze on the balance beam.

Muriel Stroda finished with a silver medal on the vault.

Delta Invitational annually hosts a cash and carry session at their competition where the athletes win sponsorship donations rather than medals. This year Sugar Tiner won the vault and finished with a third in the all around.

Makinli Handley won first place on floor and second place on the balance beam.

In the Men's competition, Liam Dawson competed in the Men's Provincial level 3 (13 and under) division. Dawson earned second place all around. He also earned a silver medal on the floor, on rings and on parallel bars and a bronze medal on pommel horse.

Stephen Hiscock earned a bronze medal on the floor exercise.

Nori Horie competed in the Men's cash and carry session and earned first place on vault and a second place on the floor exercise.
